HOLIDAY AT HOME 2010 OFFERING \$10,500 IN SCHOLARSHIPS

KETTERING, Ohio- Holiday at Home is awarding up to \$10,500 in scholarship money to this year's Queen, her court and Skip Lowe winner! Young men and women ages 17 to 21, who reside in the south suburbs of Dayton, are encouraged to participate in the Holiday at Home Pageant and Skip Lowe Community Service Award.

New this year is a slight change in the Skip Lowe Community Service Award. Typically this has been awarded to the young woman with the most community service. For 2010, the Skip Lowe award will be given to a young man with extensive community service. The winning young man will receive a \$1,500 scholarship.

Pageant and Skip Lowe contestants will be judged on community service, poise, personality, and appearance. This pageant will be held July 23 at 6:00 pm, in the Kettering Fairmont Auditorium and judged by local celebrities. The event is free and open to the public.

Since 1959, the queen and her court have reigned over the Labor Day weekend festivities in Kettering. The queen, court and Skip Lowe winner are invited to participate in a variety of activities including the Coronation Ball, Labor Day Parade, festival at Lincoln Park/Civic Commons, and a Dayton Dragon's game.
